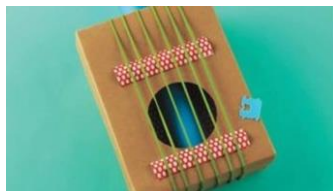

Use any empty boxes/bottles to make musical instruments.



Hide some objects in a bag, they could make a noise or have an interesting shape. Play guess what's in the bag.

Have a treasure hunt. You could make your own treasure, map and pirate hat!



Make a weather station. You could record it using a tally chart.

Play board games – these are great for developing numeracy skills and resilience.



Create your own indoor/outdoor den. It could be anything your child wants it to be, e.g. a cave, castle, tent etc.



Imitate the movements of different mini beasts, e.g. – flutter like a butterfly, move slowly like a snail, etc.
